

Growing in Faith: Reflections from the Pastor

^{2:6} "And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. ⁷And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling clothes, and laid Him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn." (Luke 2:6-7 KJV)

Imagine that. So desperate were Mary and Joseph that they had to give birth to the King of Kings in a stable, a manger. Lonely, messy, smelly. Not the likely place for royalty to be born, is it? God chose to start things radically anew with His children. God chose the stable because that's where we dwell, too. Still, to choose such a place seems incredulous to us. Yet, this stable, this manger is a most appropriate place for the Messiah to start life. For our lives have loneliness, messiness, smelliness, too. Whether it's economic, psychological, physical or spiritual, our lives at times are a mess, aren't they? God knows this. God wants us to know how much He cares and loves each of us. So, the stable, the manger is such a perfect place for the Savior to come. Remember this place. Show the love of God to others who are also in such a place. Through the Salvation Army, ECHO, GIFTS, YWCA or right here in the Church, help them. God has showed us how vital and loved all His children are whether they are in a warm home, a cold street, or even a stable, a manger. Show love and care by serving those who need. Show the love of God to them. Remind them that we, too, are or have been in their place. Remind them that God is and has been in their place, too.

Lonely, messy, smelly. God came in such a way. To be where we are. To show us there are better places and days ahead.

^{2:13} "And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the Heavenly host praising God, and saying, ¹⁴Glory to God in the highest, and on Earth peace, good will toward men." (Luke 2:13-14 KJV)

Stewardship as a Way of Life

How do we use the gifts God shares with us to serve God?

3:23 "Whatever your task, put yourselves into it, as done for the Lord and not for your masters, ²⁴since you know that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward; you serve the Lord Christ." (Colossians 3:23-24 NRSV)

We all have a number of God-given talents and skills to share with family, friends and the world. Time is a valuable gift that we can deliver in many different ways. It can be teaching a Sunday School class, serving on Church Council and committees, and helping at Worship services. We take our family to the movies, ball games, on trips, and out for ice cream. When we go with them to Worship services, we share with them the God-given gift of sending Jesus to us.

We use the gifts as teachers, scientist, doctor, minister or any other profession; when we do so, we are also serving God. We volunteer at Church to serve Communion, usher, count, make quilts, serve fellowship, sing in the choir, teach Sunday School, serve on a Committee, water flowers, mow the grass and any other of the many things needed in the Church; we are using the gifts God shares with us to also then serve God and all people. When we help neighbors, friends or strangers we use those gifts to serve God, too. 6:10 "For God is not unjust; He will not overlook your work and the love that you showed for His sake in serving the saints, as you still do." (Hebrews 6:10 NRSV)

Council Action Taken at the November Meeting.

We were very fortunate that this was a meeting with little official business, and it was able to be shorter than usual. Discussion included the busy schedules that we all will be having in the next couple of months. While we are presently involved with all of the planning around our Christmas schedules, we have already started looking at the Lenten season which begins on February 14.

Other than the regular order of business, the Council is proposing a change to the By-Laws of the Constitution that would changes the terms of office for Congregational Council members. While we presently have 1-, 2-, and 3-year terms, we are opting to change this to a one-year term with the hope that we will be able to have more members volunteer to be part of the group with shorter terms. This proposal will be considered and acted on at the Congregational Meeting in January, 2024.



Contribution Opportunities

We are again finding opportunities that individuals are needed and can contribute to the life of St. Peter's.



First, we will again be giving everyone the opportunity to contribute toward the purchase of **Communion Wine**, **Bread**

and the liquid wax used for the candles. You can sign up on the forms located on the bulletin board near the stairway going up to the balcony and adjacent to the Narthex. You only need to sign your name and the reason (in memory of or in honor of) you are contributing and place the funds in an envelope that indicates the reason for the donation. We have done this in the past and hope you will take advantage of the opportunity once again.

Second, Stewardship Sunday was October 29 and you should have received a mailing asking for your pledge as well as the opportunity to volunteer your time to assist with Worship and other activities of the Congregation. The list of individuals who volunteer to Usher, Lector and assist with Communion has become very short. Please consider volunteering to assist with these activities. If you feel unsure at first, we will offer training or make sure that you are assigned to work with someone who has served in these capacities before. It is very helpful to be able to have additional individuals who can assist as they are necessary for each Worship Service. Thank you in advance for your consideration.

Roof Repairs

Over the past couple years there has been an increased need for flat roof repairs and as we have seen issues, we have tried to arrange for the needed repairs. We have now come



to a time when it is no longer acceptable to try to fix the leaks but to repair the entire roof. Quotes have been received and since the flat roof covers three specific areas, it has been determined that the replacement should be done over the worst section first. This is the area over the second floor. For that area alone the quotes range from \$42,515 to \$52,500. At present time the Church Council is investigating all possible avenues as to how this cost can be covered. We welcome any suggestions that you would have, and all suggestions will be considered. More information will follow as it becomes available. We thank you all for your continued support of St. Peter's while keeping in mind that our building is now 60 plus years old and in constant need of proactive repairs.
