Jonah, Haggai, Obadiah, oh my! Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Iay, carrumba! Zechariah, Micah, Amos, what a mess! Hosea, Joel, Malachi, when will it end?! Strange names, to be sure. While they may be called "minor," they are anything but that. Yes, these are the Twelve Minor Prophets from the Old Testament, but their words and actions speak in a major way. Several of these prophets spoke to and of the Messiah, many spoke to the shenanigans of the Israelites, all of them speak to us. During the Wednesday evenings in Lent, we will get to know these twelve important figures in Biblical history. Warm and fuzzy they were not. The Council did not meet as a group this month due to the weather however we did have an Email Meeting in order to complete a couple agenda items that needed attention.

The Council approved the Annual Meeting Agenda so the report could be completed and distributed.

The quote from McCann Flooring for tile for the room located adjacent to the Fellowship Hall for \$3,347 was also approved. The flooring in this room was badly damaged due to water issues some years ago and the old tile removed and now needs to be replaced. The room will be renamed to the Bazaar Committee room and will be used to keep items that are being donated to use for the Bazaar. At present there are many wheeled shelving units that will stay in the room to make storage convenient and assure that there is no damage to the items in the room. The Congregation will pay for half of the expense and the remainder will be paid with Bazaar Committee funds.

#583 Take My Life, That I May Be [Jesus said,]<sup>25:34</sup> "Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; <sup>35</sup> for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me. <sup>36</sup>I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' <sup>37</sup>Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? <sup>38</sup>And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? <sup>39</sup>And when was it that we saw *you sick or in prison and visited you?*' <sup>40</sup>*And the* king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me. '"(Matthew 25:34-40 NRSV)

Frances Ridley Havergal was born at Astley,

Worcestershire, December 14, 1836. In August, 1850, she entered Mrs. Teed's school, whose influence over her was most beneficial. In the following year she says, "I committed my soul to the Savior, and Earth and Heaven seemed brighter from that moment." A short sojourn in Germany followed, and on her return she was confirmed

in Worcester Cathedral, July 17, 1853. She died at Caswell Bay, Swansea, June 3, 1879.

Miss Havergal's scholastic acquirements were extensive, embracing several modern languages, together with Greek and Hebrew. She does not claim for herself a prominent place as a poet, but by her distinct individuality she carved out a niche which she alone could fill. Simply and sweetly she sang the love of God, and His way of salvation. To this end, and for this object, her whole life and all her powers were consecrated. She lives and speaks in every line of her poetry. Her poems are permeated with the fragrance of her passionate love of Jesus. The burden of her writings is a free and full salvation, through the Redeemer's merits, for every sinner who will receive it, and her life was devoted to the proclamation of this truth by personal labors, literary efforts, and earnest interest in Foreign Missions. Besides "Take My Life, That I May Be" she wrote over 60 hymns

We ask God to lead us to share what we have whether it is our treasure, our gifts and our life that we may use these to please Him by using them to help others. The hymn is an acceptance of God's invitation to follow Jesus and to serve through Him. Once we commit our life and treasure to following the teachings and example of Jesus, we can give to others and share the message and do so based on trust, fairness and a sense of fulfillment.


