12 Stewardship Principles

As members of the Body of Christ, we confess Jesus as our Lord and Savior. We proclaim the Gospel as the Word of God. In our faith we recognize the gifts which God has first given us through grace and accept our role as stewards. The principles we will explore each month throughout 2025 provide a foundation for our role as faithful stewards.

8:5b "...[They] gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us..." (2 Corinthians 8:5b NRSV) Being a proportionate steward is our way of giving in relation to our abundance. We are to give according to our "means," not according to our income or a budget. Paul told the Corinthians:

8:12"For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has — not according to what one does not have."

(2 Corinthians 8:12 NRSV)

Being a proportionate steward is our way of giving in relation to our abundance. We are to give according to our "means," not according to our income or budget. Paul wrote to the Corinthians:

8:12"For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has — not according to what one does not have." (2 Corinthians 8:12 NRSV) This verse from Second Corinthians tells us that we should give according to what we have. If we are to give not according to our income but according to our means, it seems to us that if we own a big house and a car or two as well as having money in the bank, possibly jewelry or antiques that are valued highly, that this would be our means and we should give accordingly to that and not just to our actual income or budget. What if we give according to our net worth?

How much should we (or, do we) regularly give to the Church? What proportion of what we have is the appropriate amount? Is it always all about money? The Church does have bills to pay, this is true. There is a constant need for members to donate time and skills to benefit the Church's message. Our attending Worship enhances the service. So, no, it's not always all about money. Proportionate to what we have can include all of these things when done to the point where we feel that we really belong.

Whatever we have (or don't have) matters little to God – except for love. He has shared an infinite supply of love with us all and, just perhaps, He would like to see that shared with His children. We have received love in abundance; we should give love in abundance. This love, of course, can be in the form of helping another, sharing a meal with someone, offering a shoulder to cry and pray on, offering our story to one who is struggling with their faith. Love in abundance, love shared. May

not necessarily be proportionate, but I think God will give us a pass, don't you?

Our role as God's stewards is one of many dimensions – grateful, responsible, self-sacrificing, willing, sharing, proportionate, committed, regular, genuine, and challenges. By giving of ourselves, we share the Joy of Christ. We give first to Jesus, then to others, and then to ourselves.




