Council Corner

Many topics were covered with main items listed below:

1404 Update—The Restoration Group and the YWCA are still both very interested in renting the house. At this time, neither of them is able to make a commitment but both continue to make plans they'd need to implement if able to commit soon. We are still looking for options as they present themselves. If anyone is aware of a not-for-profit group that would be interested, please let us know.

Anniversary Committee Formation—In 3 years, we will be celebrating our 125th Anniversary and need to begin making some plans and reserving dates. At present we have three members who have voiced an interest at being a part of this group and would like at least seven to share the load. Please consider this opportunity to serve and let Barb Kienbaum or the office know of your interest.

HeadStart Lease—We are happy to announce that HeadStart has signed a 3-year lease with us. We are so pleased that this relationship will continue. We have been working very hard to assure that they are able to serve our Community at our location and will do so in the future.

Discussion of Our Shut-in Members—We discussed the need to inform the Congregation of the members who cannot join us for Worship. In addition to Pastor recording his sermon weekly, it was decided that we needed to post the contact information of these members on a bulletin board including their picture, address and phone number so that all members could contact them. We also discussed the topic of visiting those who cannot attend and suggested that we have further discussion on how we might be able to enhance our visiting. More information is needed and will follow as we do additional planning.

Roof Project—The roof in the last phase of repair. The hope is that by the time you receive this communication the roof project will be completed.

Water Issues in the Lower Level—We have experienced many episodes of water in the lower level of the church building and are in the process of trying to evaluate the causes so necessary repairs can be made. We have discovered that many of the drainage lines to the city sewer lines have been blocked with tree roots and are having these lines cleaned out to ensure proper water drainage. Derek and Teresa Mallory volunteered to apply a water-proofing material to the walls and floor of the storeroom

adjacent to the playground to prevent water from leaking into the building. We have already seen a benefit from this and thank them for their time and effort. In addition, we are replacing the carpet in one of the classrooms with tile to hopefully eliminate the cost of cleaning and sanitizing the carpet whenever there is water in the area. We will continue to make the needed changes as we get more information.

Thank You to Mary Esser—Tim and Mary Esser and Jack Kutzler are relocating to Kenosha. We are very sorry to see them leave us and thank Mary for all her efforts while being part of the Congregational Council. We wish them well in their new location.



As members of the Body of Christ, we confess Jesus as our Lord and Savior. We proclaim the Gospel as the Word of God. In our faith we recognize the gifts which God has first given us through grace and accept our role as stewards. The principles we will explore each month throughout 2025 provide a foundation for our role as faithful stewards.

8:5b "...[They] gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us..." (2 Corinthians 8:5b NRSV)

Being a genuine steward means putting your faith into action. This is the tangible demonstration of what is sincerely on our hearts, not simply a verbal expression. The Macedonians set an example that Paul called to the attention of the Corinthians:

8:8"I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others." (2 Corinthians 8:8 NRSV)

Jesus calls us to action. That's what serving means. We are all called by God to act in a variety of ways. All in response to what Jesus, God, did on that old Cross—the ultimate act of service. For who? You and I and all God's children were served by God through the Cross of Jesus. Served to bring us forgiveness. Served to redeem us. Served to bring us life abundant and life everlasting. We can put this act of service into action and, at the very least, serve one another and other. While Jesus does know us (and He knows us intimately), He still serves us. We can, and must do the same with all God's children. And as Christian stewards, we are asked to live Christian lives; to give to ourselves, our families, our friends and others we pass on our journey and not rely on the efforts and contributions of others; all in direct response to the act of

the Cross. Playing it forward is one way to say, get and keep the ball rolling.

Being a genuine steward means, then, putting our faith into action. How do we do this? There are many ways we can demonstrate our faith. The first and most important act is what we do to demonstrate our faith and not just what we say. When we give of our time to help others, when we give of our treasure to the Church as well as to charities, when we worship and thank God for our blessings. These are just a few of the things we can do that come from our heart and it is not just blowing smoke. We listen to Jesus' call to action. And, we serve. Lovingly. Caringly. Faithfully.

Our role as God's stewards is one of many dimensions—grateful, responsible, self-sacrificing, willing, sharing, proportionate, committed, regular, genuine, and challenges. By giving of ourselves, we share the Joy of Christ. We give first to Jesus, then to others, and then to ourselves.
